HOW TO SPROUT SEEDS FOR YOUR BIRD

STUFF YOU'LL NEED:

- 1. A bag of bird seeds (we got the cheapest bag from our neighbourhood pet shop)
- 2. Air-tight container e.g. a Fido jar (with metal clasp lid) or Mason Jar will work
- 3. Planting pot with multiple small drainage holes and saucer.

 *We got another deeper and larger saucer to catch any excess liquid which may spill over
- 4. Disposable kitchen towels
- 5. Fruit netting mesh (recycle fruit meshes from the wet market or get them from Daiso)
- 6. A clean dry cloth



THE PROCESS:




PREPARING THE SEEDS

Rinse the seeds a few times then immerse them in the air-tight container for 12 hours.

Make sure the seeds are submerged in water.

Tip: Don't use too much seeds.
You can gauge a good amount by
placing the seeds into the planting
pot first, and make sure it is not
too thick a layer. Anything over
1cm in height is considered a little
too thick.



PRIMING THE SEEDS FOR GROWTH

Assemble your sprouting apparatus:

- Line the bottom of the planting pot with the netting mesh
- Fold 2 sheets of kitchen towel together and line it over the mesh
- Put the planting pot in the saucers

Drain the water from the air-tight container as much as you can.

Scoop the wet seeds out and place them on the kitchen towel in the pot.

Cover the pot with a dry cloth and keep it away from direct sunlight.



WATERING THE SEEDS

For the next couple of days, rinse the seeds by adding a bit of water directly to the pot, swish it and then drain it. Same way as if you are washing rice.

Rinse up to 3 - 4 times a day (or every 4 hours). There's no need to stay up to rinse the seeds overnight.

Repeat the rinsing until you see seeds starting to sprout. *It took us around 3 days to get sprouts.

*Note: Bird seeds usually come assorted in a bag. This means there are different kinds of seeds in there and each may require a different amount of time to start sprouting.



HARVESTING THE SPROUTS

You can harvest the sprouts once they have roots and shoots. Pick out these little sprouts and store them.

How to store?

Put the sprouts in a storage bowl that's lined with kitchen towels to absorb any residual moisture.

Cover the bowl and pop it in the refrigerator.

KEEPING THE SPROUTS:

You can store sprouted seeds in the refrigerator for up to 6 days. Before you feed your bird the sprouts, be sure to check for any signs of mould growth or if the sprouts have started becoming slimy. You can do a quick sniff to check if the sprouts have gone off.

*Note: Only feed your birds the seeds that have sprouted. Add these nutritious sprouts to their regular food or as treats. Please throw away seeds which have not sprouted.
